- > Park like environment with 23 landscaped rest areas with benches, 7 gazebos/pergolas, 10 trail heads with parking, 3 Little Free Libraries, 5 archways, pedestrian bridge, 2 bike repair stations, Nebraska Arboretum.
- Connects two Nebraska State Recreation Areas (SRA) with water and rest rooms.
- Other area amenities include rental cabins. restaurants, swimming beach, chapel, playgrounds, Lakeside Golf Course, brewery, lavender farm, motels.
